Serving our Neighbors in Need

We want to help you get to know more about our SVDP conference and their efforts by featuring a story from one of our neighbors in need each month.

A SVDP Story: Alvaro's Story

Alvaro had his own landscaping business but in his mid-40s he began to have heart problems and could no longer do much heavy work; he lost his business a couple years ago – and then lost his apartment. He's been homeless for two years. He is now living in a trailer in Golden owned by relatives – no heat and no plumbing. In January he began working at an apartment complex in our parish boundaries; he commutes by light rail and bus. His manager suggested he ask us for help.

He could have a 30% employee discount on the rent at the apartment complex – but his application was rejected because of the unpaid rent from two years ago, which has been turned over to a collection agency. The debt was approximately \$1500, but interest and fees have the total now at \$2300. Worse – we learned when we met with him that beginning with his March 28 paycheck, his biweekly wages will be garnished by \$400. The total payments garnished over 12 months will be more than double the amount owed now.

Thanks to generous gifts from the SVdP at St Mary's and Good Shepherd, we are going to pay off the remaining \$1900 owed, which will put an end to the garnishment. Once the credit report reflects the payment, Alvaro can re-apply for an apartment.
