FROM FR. DANIEL

Dear brothers and sisters,

The last seconds of Jesus's life on earth were surely memorable for the apostles. One wonders if that moment remained in their hearts, as if slowly allowing them to unlock its meaning. In those final seconds, they saw Jesus blessing them as He ascended into heaven. What did that mean?

An evident explanation is that the Lord wanted to bless them because He was leaving. No doubt this is true, and yet, there is a deeper meaning. The blessing given by Jesus is not only a parting gesture, but the beginning of his new presence—He stays with his disciples in a new way: not walking with them in Galilee, but with his constant spiritual presence which blesses their lives and strengthens them to witness to his love.

The ascension makes the beginning of a new relationship with Christ, one which became the normal way to follow Him: being blessed by his presence, most especially in the sacraments. May we appreciate the gift of his blessing, and rejoice that after his ascension, He is with us always, until the end of times.

We want to help you get to know more about our SVDP conference and their efforts by featuring a story from one of our neighbors in need each month.

A SVDP Story: Andrea and Robert's Story

Sometimes our efforts to help our neighbors involve unexpected surprises! Andrea and Robert are a young couple in their mid-20s. When Andrea called the parish office, she requested \$1,450 in rent assistance. Robert had been laid off from his warehouse job in January and hadn't found a job or received unemployment benefits. Andrea was temporarily unemployed but would return to work June 1. When we visited them, we were in for a surprise. They were actually \$3,100 behind in rent - in fact they had already been to Court and had 10 days to pay up or vacate - or the sheriff would remove their belongings. What to do? Let them be evicted ... or try to buy time? We decided to make a best effort to keep them in their apartment. We contacted Catholic Charities and had a commitment for \$1,450. We were about to request help from other SVdP conferences when there was another surprise. Andrea and Robert had both found good jobs and their going-forward situation was now secure. Then another surprise! Andrea had applied for rent assistance from the State – and on the very last day before we had delivered our checks and the eviction would occur - she was notified that they received rent assistance for 2 months! Total outlay from SVdP -\$0. Time, prayers, and the excitement of sharing the amazing turn of events for this young couple!
